- Whilst involved in a study of 29 European lakes, Fellow Professor David Aldridge (1997) has
 found that some naturally occurring lake bacteria grow better on the remains of plastic bags
 than on natural matter like leaves and twigs, offering a natural way to remove plastic pollution

As part of the programme, you will receive 1.5 hours of training each week and 1on1 support in designing and executing your project!
