- Chloe from Plant-Based Universities Cambridge has got in touch with us about a new campaign:
 - **Plant-Based Universities** (PBU) is a student-led climate campaign asking for the university catering services to transition to fully plant-based catering in response to the climate and biodiversity crises.
 - A fully plant-based food system would reduce greenhouse gas emissions from agricultural production by 61%, as well as freeing up 76% of global farmland for

rewilding. In a large institution like the University of Cambridge, the impact of reducing meat and dairy consumption would be significant.

The PBU campaign is entirely focused on **institutional change**. We are asking the University of Cambridge to shoulder the climate burden and take decisive action for the good of all students. A major part of our campaign involves demonstrating how plant-based catering can be just and accessible to all.
